### **Indian General Assistance IGA:**

General assistance clients are provided assistance while seeking employment or whom has a medical disability preventing the client from entering the workforce. This service is available to WPRT tribal Members or a member of a federally recognized tribe whom reside on the Walker River Paiute Tribe reservation. This service is only available when no other resources are available to an individual. ***Must fill out application and interview by case worker to fully complete eligibility***

### **Burial Assistance:**

this service is available to tribal members of WRPT or a person enrolled in a federally recognized tribe, must reside in the service area of Schurz and meet income guidelines and **complete application.**

### **WRPT Burial Assistance:**

Available to all tribal members upon verification of enrollment by the Eligibility Tech and **complete application.**

### **ICWA Services:**

Indian child welfare is in places to make sure Indian children are placed in relative placement or Indian family foster care before being placed into state foster care or put up for adoption.

## What is Domestic Violence

Domestic violence is a pattern of abusive behaviors in any relationship that is used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another intimate partner.

Domestic violence can be physical, sexual, emotional, economic, psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person.

This includes any behaviors that intimidate, manipulate, humiliate, isolate, frighten, terrorize, coerce, threaten, blame, hurt, injure, or wound someone.

## WRPT Victim Services

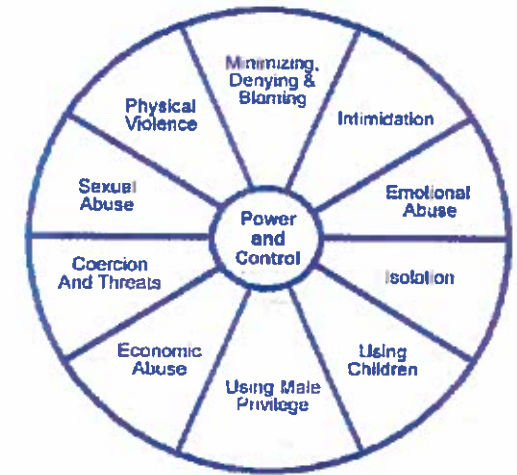
The Walker River Paiute Tribe Victim Services Program is an Emergency Based Program that is designed to provide services to Victims of Crime, Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, Elder Abuse, Dating Violence and stalking.

### Services Available

- ⇒ 24 hour crisis intervention
- ⇒ Emergency services: relocation, clothing, transportation
- ⇒ Individual/ group counseling
- ⇒ Legal services
- ⇒ Court accompaniment
- ⇒ Referrals
- ⇒ Emotional support
- ⇒ Life skills development

Services and assistance offered will be determined on a case by case basis and dependent on victim's needs. All services will be provided in a confidential and sensitive manner to protect the victim's right to privacy.

## DID YOU KNOW.....

- ◆ Native American women experience domestic violence at rates 50% higher than other racial groups.
- ◆ Native American and Alaskan native women are 2.5 times more likely than general U.S. female population to experience sexual assault.
- ◆ According to the National Violence Against Women Survey, 37.5% of Native American women are victimized by intimate partner violence in their lifetime.
- ◆ The stalking rate against Native American and Alaska Native women is so high that 17% will be stalked during their lifetime.
- ◆ A national survey found 15.5% of Native American couples reported violence within their marriage, 7.2% of that was severe violence.
- ◆ 34% of Native American and Alaska Native women reported experiencing an attempted or completed rape in their lifetime.
