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RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE WALKER RIVER PAIUTE TRIBE

RESOLUTION WR-50-2020

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TRIBAL COUNCIL OF THE WALKER RIVER PAIUTE TRIBE THAT:

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Walker River Paiute Tribe is organized under the provisions of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) as amended, to exercise certain rights of home rule and be responsible for the promotion of the economic and social welfare of its members; and

WHEREAS, the Walker River Paiute Tribe has the responsibility to provide for the health, social welfare and protection of its membership and to ensure police protection is provided to the community; and

WHEREAS, one of the Tribe's inherent sovereign powers is to remove, banish or exclude non-members of the Tribe from the Reservation for adverse acts, including without limitation when such non-members have violated Tribal or other applicable law or otherwise pose a threat to the natural, social and psychological well-being of the Tribe, it's members or other persons; and

WHEREAS, Andrew Crutcher a transient, recently spent time on the Reservation riding around in an un registered vehicle with various Tribal members, when Tribal Police discovered Crutcher was subsequently arrested in Fallon City for attempted murder against a homeless handicapped man in a particularly violent and egregious manner and

WHEREAS, Mr. Crutcher's conduct and presence on the Reservation threatens the peace, health, safety, morals and general welfare of the Tribe, it's members and other persons;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Walker River Paiute Tribal Council, the governing body of the Walker River Paiute Tribe, under authority of the Tribe's Constitution and By-Laws and/or in the exercise of the Tribe's inherent powers, hereby removes, banishes and excludes Andrew Crutcher from the Walker River Paiute Reservation and any lands the Tribe may acquire in the future.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said removal, banishment and exclusion is effective for Mr. Crutcher's lifetime.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Walker River Paiute Tribal Council hereby declares and provides notice to Mr. Crutcher that if he enters upon any Tribal lands within the Walker River Paiute Reservation for any reason, such action shall constitute an unlawful trespass pursuant to

Walker River Tribal Law and Order Code 5-70-050 and/or applicable Federal Law, and that he shall be accordingly subject to arrest and prosecution, and/or subject to civil liability; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this action is final and not open for review under any circumstances by order of the governing body of the Walker River Paiute Tribe.

CERTIFICATION

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that the foregoing resolution of the Walker River Paiute Tribal Council of the Walker River Paiute Tribe, composed of five members, of whom 5 constituting a quorum were present at a meeting held on the *14th day of May 2020*, and that the foregoing resolution was adopted by the affirmative vote **5 FOR, 0 AGAINST, 0 ABSTENTIONS**, pursuant to the authority contained in Article VI, Section I (e), of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Walker River Paiute Tribe of Nevada approved on March 26, 1937.
