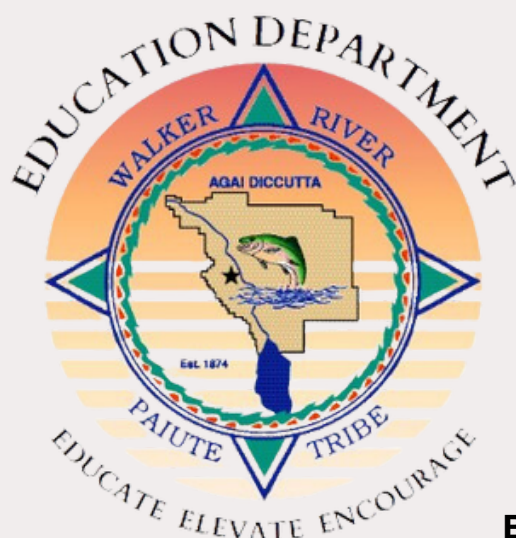

Walker River Paiute Tribe Graduation Stoles Available for Fall/Spring 2024-2025 Graduates

The Education Department of the Walker River Paiute Tribe rewards students striving to complete continuing education goals and academic success. The Graduation Stole program is available for enrolled members of the Walker River Paiute Tribe who are currently graduating within their academic school year. The program offers the opportunity to receive graduation stole for one Associate's, Bachelor's, Master's, or Doctoral Degree. Students graduating from 8th grade, high school, vocational programs, or proprietary schools are eligible. Parents/Legal guardians must complete an application for any child(ren) under 18.

DEADLINES: Fall Graduates: November 15 (mailing purposes only)
Spring Graduates: April 15 (mailing purposes only)

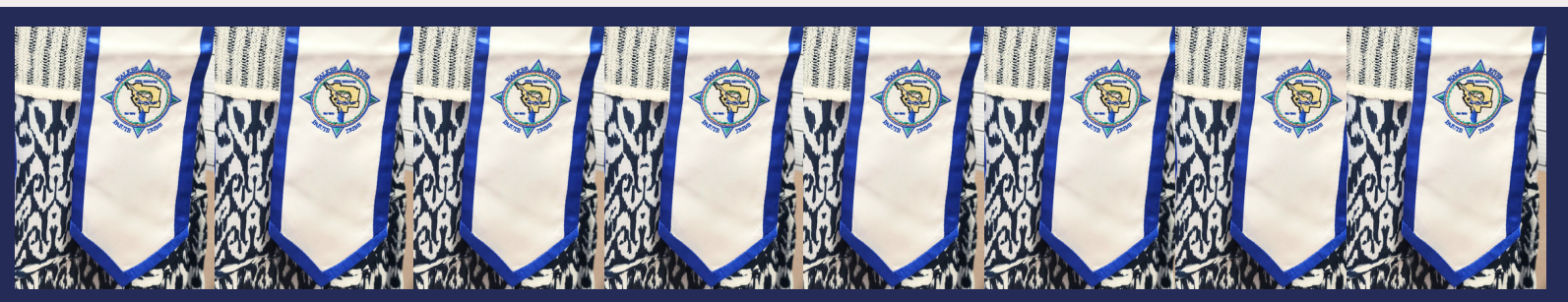

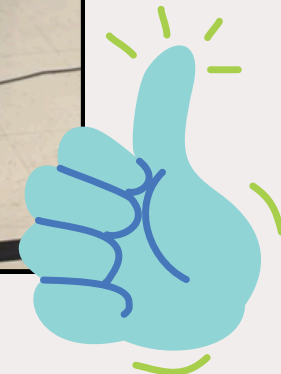

Faylah Quintero attends Hawthorne Elementary School and poses with her multiple awards including Mathematician, Reading, and Good Citizenship!

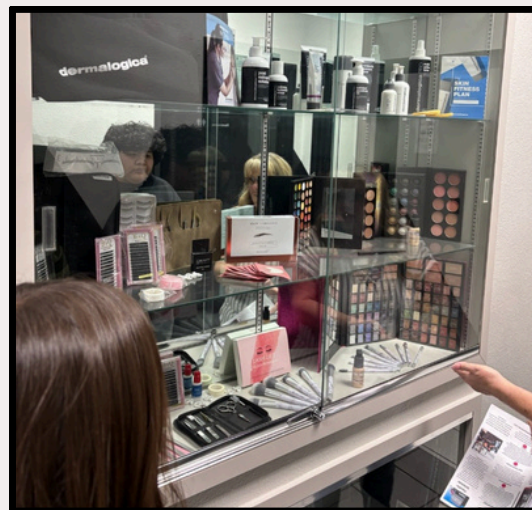

The group was able to tour through the Stewart Indian Museum and spend time doing a hands-on activity making deer from willow and hearing a story of the deer. They received guidance from Melanie Smokey, Education Curator of Stewart Indian School Cultural Center & Museum, talked about the History of the 90 Years about Stewart. Students also learned about how the basketry and items are preserved and carefully handled within the museum for safe keepings, as well as the delicate nature of these timeless items. Students were able to walk through the self-guided portion of the Stewart Indian Museum, learning about the histories and what past residences and boarding school members endured while attending at Stewart Indian School.

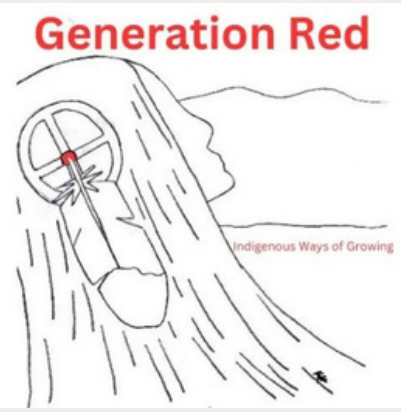

This session provided youth with numerous benefits, including enhancements in physical, emotional, and spiritual health through their work with horses. Equine-assisted learning involves so many benefits to our health and education about our relationship with animals, including a powerful spiritual stance against any harms to our communities.

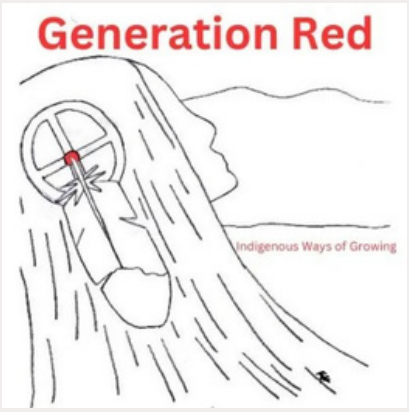

2025 Nevada Afterschool Showcase

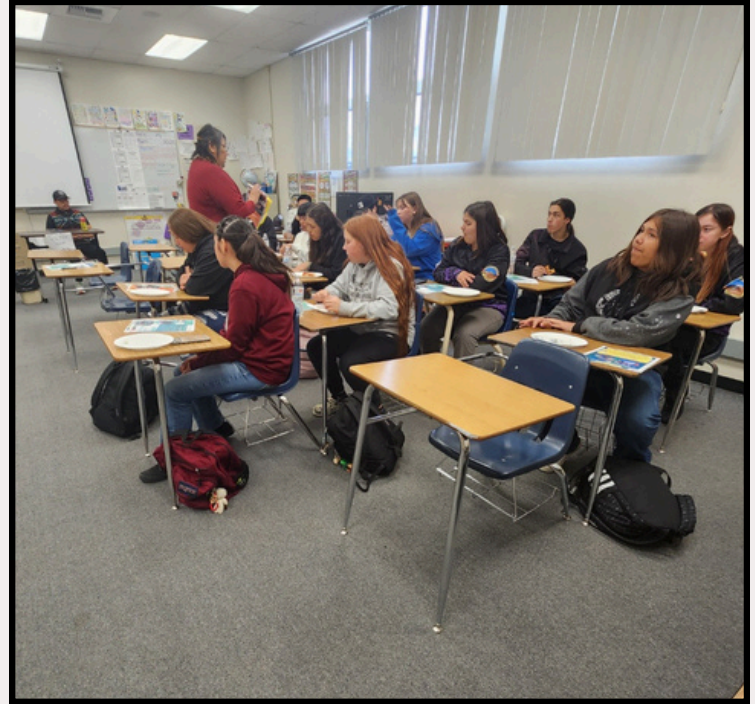


On Feb 27-28, the Education Director, Sara Twiss attended the presented during the 2025 Nevada Afterschool Showcase, a statewide conference that brings together afterschool and out-of-school time (OST) professionals and leaders in the field to learn about innovative ways to enhance program quality and empower programs and youth to achieve their goals. During the closing plenary session, she was able to present on Native Community & Culture in Education & OST Programming, along with Fredina Drye-Romero, Education Programs Professional for Indian Education, Nevada Department of Education, Stacey Montooth, Executive Director of the Nevada Department of Native American Affairs, and Letisha Yellowhawk, Cultural & Library Program Coordinator, Fallon Paiute Shoshone Tribe. They engaged the attendees in a conversation about Nevada Tribal OST programs and ways to involve Native American students in youth programming.
